Qualified coach delivered sporting activities to groups of children at lunchtime	Children were more active at playtime through choice due to the range of activities on offer.	Availability of coaches during school hours is limited. The school continue to look additional, quality coaches with availability during school hours.
Significant investment in playground equipment	Due to the NHS/government guidance issued that children are expected to have at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, we have invested heavily in ensuring the children have plenty of playground resources to stay active such space hoppers, balls, skipping ropes, hula-hoops etc.	This equipment is consumable as it is well used by lots of children and so needs replacing frequently.

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EYFS offer for physical activity outside has been enhanced due to significant investment in large resources to develop children's gross motor skills during continuous provision in their outdoor area.	Engagement in physical activity has risen and added huge variety for the children to develop different muscle groups.	This investment will be ongoing over this year and next year due to the success of the purchases made.
